SITTING BABY BY STITCH PEOPLE

What do you do when you need to include a baby in your stitch people portrait, but the baby isn't a swaddled newborn but isn't quite old enough to stand on his or her own? How about a sitting baby! Place the sitting baby lower in the portrait than the other characters, so it appears to be sitting on the same level as the standing characters. This will require more space between the bottom of the standing character's feet and the first line of text. Try 3 lines of space instead of the recommended 2. This will allow for one line of space between the bottom of the standing characters' feet and the first line of text, and will allow for three lines of space between the standing characters' feet and the first line of text, and baby will appear to be sitting on the same "level" as the standing characters.

Combine dark and light threads of a similar color to create a textured pattern in the blanket!
